Private Members Bill on animal transport tabled in Parliament

October 28 was a red-letter day for CCFA's animal transport campaign! MP Alexandra Mendes (*Liberal*, *Brossard-La Prairie*) tabled a Private Members Bill in the House, calling for a reduction in transport time to eight hours (from the current 36 hours) for poultry, pigs and horses, and 12 hours (from the current 52 hours) for cattle, sheep and goats. Co-signers of the bill (*so far*) include Alex Atamanenko (*NDP*, *BC Southern Interior*), and Frank Valeriote (*Liberal*, *Guelph*).

The MPs participated in a news conference on the Hill featuring five chicken-costumed humans crammed in a minivan with inadequate head room – just as Canadian

poultry endure during transport to slaughter. **CCFA** worked with Mrs. Mendes' office on the news conference. Canadian Coalition for Farm Animals thanks Animal Alliance of Canada, WSPA Canada, Teresa Sgrignuoli, MPs Alexandra Mendes, Alex Atamanenko and Frank Valeriote, and Shawn Murphy, Ms. Mendes' Parliamentry Assistant, for their assistance.
